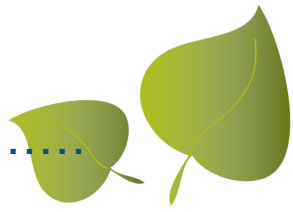

### OCTOBER 19

CANADIAN WOMEN IN AVIATION

The CAHS celebrates Women's History Month with guest speaker Shirlee Matheson. Ms. Matheson has written a number of short books on aviation history, and last spring attended the Women Aviation international conference in Nashville, TN. At the conference, she shared a room with Rosella Bjornson, Canada's first female airline pilot and captain, who flew for Air Canada as recently as 2004!

### NOVEMBER 16

DR. SARAH CARTER:

WOMEN'S SUFFRAGE ON THE PRAIRIES

Dr. Carter is Henry Marshall Tory Chair in the Department of History at the University of Alberta, and professor in both the faculties of history and Native Studies. As well, she is adjunct professor with Athabasca University. Her research focusses on the history of Western Canada, especially the late nineteenth century. Dr. Carter has many publications, among them several books on women on the prairies as well as one specifically on the suffrage movement in Canada.

JUDY CARLETON:

ARTHUR DOUGLAS GREGSON AND THE  
DEVELOPMENT OF BLACKFALDS

Ms. Judy Carleton is president of the Blackfalds and Area Historical Society, and curator of the Blackfalds archives. She has also authored several books on Blackfalds history, one specifically for the Blackfalds centennial in 2004.

Mr. Gregson is an interesting subject - entymologist, official weed inspector, and later in life a newspaper man; he was raised in England, moved to Blackfalds, and among many interests collected and curated fleas, which he sent home to England for the Rothschild collection!

### FEBRUARY 15

BERTRAND BICKERSTETH:

UNRECOGNIZED BLACK PIONEERS IN ALBERTA

For Black History Month we welcome back Bertrand Bickersteth for Part II in our series on black settlers. Mr. Bickersteth was born in Sierra Leone, raised in Canada, and educated in the UK. He explores black identity in Alberta and his poetry is included in the anthology *The Great Black North: Contemporary African Canadian Poetry*.

Budding historians from the classes of Dr. Stéphane Perreault (RDC) will present us with their latest research. These will be related to one of the history courses Dr. Perreault teaches, and may touch on Canada's sesquicentennial.
